Copenhagen 2021 is the joint celebration of EuroGames and WorldPride and is set to be one of the biggest events ever held in Copenhagen. Copenhagen 2021 is made up of four intertwined pillars focusing on Human Rights, Sports, Pride and Culture.

The Culture and Identity program is bridging the four pillars through art and culture and creating thematic and involved venues for all our thousands of guests.

Your main tasks will concern planning the daily program and construction design for two major and centrally located venues for LGBTI+ youth and allies.

Examples of tasks:

- Assisting in the planning of two major venues for LGBTI+ youth and allies.
- Preparing and attending meetings with partners and stakeholders.
- Coordinating the space-setting of the venues with our production team.
- Assisting the Director of Culture and Identity during the events taking place at the venues in August 2021.

Concise information of the venues:

The youth venues are located inside Huset KBH and outside on a nearby square. Inside the house we will create a safe space for young LGBTI+ persons and their allies that through its welcoming atmosphere can give room and context for important discussions where the young people are both in focus and in charge.

Outside in the front yard, our guests are to take center-stage in Copenhagen 2021 - from relaxed activities such as preparing their participation in the WorldPride Parade, to classic Danish panel-debates, talks, entertainment, DJ-sets and maybe our new intern can come up with more?

Opening days 14 – 22 August 2021

The program at each venue will be developed in collaboration with partners from the LGBTI+ community, commercial partners, and professional cultural organizers. Your job is to stay on top of it all, to assist the Director of Culture and Identity to keep an overview and make sense of the details.

 We are open to schedule around your schedule. As our program takes place 12-22
 August 2021, we hope to keep you within the organization throughout the final stage of project.
- You are interested in LGTBI+ equality and human rights
- You are familiar with youth culture in general and interested in LGBTI+ art and culture specifically.
- You have experience with or an interest in working with major events.
- You are well-organized, hands on and willing to work towards the execution of Copenhagen 2021.
- You are fluent in English and well-read in Danish
